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Grammar Unit 4:

Countable and uncountable nouns:

Countable noun: it's a noun that you can count.

A sandwich, a teacher, a pen, ...

Uncountable noun: it's a noun that you can not count.

Water, rice, shampoo, oil, wine, ...

Attention!!!

An uncountable noun can be countable. How?

Using containers (glasses, bottles, briks, ...), litres, kg, ml, ...

a bottle of shampoo, a glass of water, two briks of milk, ...

Determiners: a / an, some, any, the.

Alan (un/a): singular countable nouns.

a + consonant, a plane

an + vowel, an apple

Some / any: countable nouns in plural / uncountable nouns in singular.

(+) (-/?)

I have got some pens.
I haven't got any pens.
Have you got any pens?

I bought some coffee.
I didn't buy any coffee.
Did you buy any coffee?

Attention!

Some in questions: offers or petitions that we expect "yes" as answer.

Would you like some coffee? Yes, please.

Can I have some water, please? Of course.

There is I are = hi ha (singular and plural).

Singular

- (+) There is or There's ...
- () There is not / isn't ...
- (?) [Wh- questions] + is there

Plural

- (+) There are Never there're!!!
- () There are not / aren't ...
- (?) [Wh- questions] + are there ...

Examples:

There is = hi ha (singular)

- (+) There is a fly in my soup.
- () There isn't a fly in my soup.
- (?) Is there a fly in my soup?
- (?) What is there in my soup? A fly? Yes, there is / No, there isn't.

<mark>There are</mark> = hi ha (plural)

- **(+)** There are some flies in my soup.
- () There aren't any flies in my soup.
- (?) Are there any flies in my soup?
- (?) What insects are there in my soup? Flies? Yes, there are / No, there aren't.

Much, many and a lot of

(+) sentences: a lot of

Uncountable nouns in singular (molt/molta)

I have got a lot of homework to do.

There's **a lot of smoke**.

Countable nouns in plural (molts/moltes)

There are **a lot people** in the party.

I have got a lot of pens in my pencil case.

(- and ?) sentences: much and many

Uncountable nouns in singular

(-) gaire o no massa

I haven't got much money left.

I haven't got **much homework** to do today.

(?) gaire o molta quantitat

Have you got **much money** left? Yes, I have / No, I haven't.

Have you got <u>much homework</u> to do today? Yes, I have / No, I haven't.

Countable nouns in plural

(-) gaires o no molts/es

I haven't got many coins left.

I haven't got **many exercises** to do today.

(?) uns/es quants/es - més quantitat que 'some' = alguns/es

Have you got many coins left? Yes, I have / No, I haven't.

Have you got **many exercises** to do today? Yes, I have / No, I haven't.

Quantifiers: How much ... / How many ...?

How much ... Uncountable nouns (before uncountable nouns in singular): quant ... (fent referència a la quantitat).

How much money have you got in your pocket?

How much sugar have you got in your mug?

How many ... Countable nouns (before plural nouns): quants / quantes

How many friends have you got?

How many books has your brother got?
